

TAKE JOY IN THE OPEN TRAIL

2019 ANNUAL REPORT

Dear Members and MST Enthusiasts:

Little did we know in 2019 what 2020 would bring. A pandemic erupted. By March events were cancelled, and the Governor had issued an order that required people to socially distance. At that time of fear and uncertainty, people looked to nature for solace, and the MST was there to help.

The MST is there because of the steady commitment of thousands of people over many years – people who give, volunteer and advocate. And 2019 was no exception. It was an extraordinary year of progress – and joy – on the MST.

The MST extends 1,175 miles across North Carolina from Clingmans Dome in the Smokies to Jockey's Ridge on the Outer Banks. It now includes more than 720 miles of footpath, and about 455 miles of connector roads linking trail segments. Each year, Friends of the MST and its partners press toward the goal of a continuous linear park of natural wonders spanning North Carolina.

In 2019, Friends of MST members came together to learn about and celebrate the trail in March and again in September, and our trail crews worked hard and fast to reopen trail damaged by the fierce hurricanes of 2018.

Miles of new trail opened – extending the longest continuous off-road section to 361 miles and adding the first trail in parts of the state where none had been built before. Thanks to a generous grant from the Duke Energy Foundation, Friends was able to hire a landscape architect to focus full-time on building new trail in the Coastal Plain.

Thousands of people took joy in the Mountains-to-Sea Trail in 2019. Delighting in a short jaunt or undertaking a months' long trek across North Carolina. Walking alone or with family and friends. Running into neighbors. Working as part of a trail crew that becomes like a family over time. Building a legacy for North Carolina.

We hope you will enjoy this report on our accomplishments in 2019 and support our continued work for the MST.

Off-Road MST Extends 361 Miles from **Clingmans Dome Through Stone Mountain State Park**

Two new sections of trail were completed in late 2019 to create a continuous 11.3-mile off-road route for the MST through Stone Mountain State Park (Segment 6). The trail now stretches through the park from the Blue Ridge Parkway at Devils Garden Overlook to the John P. Frank Parkway on the east side. The new route takes hikers over Wolf Rock and Cedar Rock with views of Stone Mountain and the Hutchinson Homestead.

Thanks to North Carolina State Parks as well as our partner Elkin Valley Trails Association (EVTA) for planning and constructing the new trail, some of which required skilled blasting. EVTA has also continued its work with private landowners to construct trail from Stone Mountain State Park to downtown Elkin, and hikers heading east from the park can follow another 2.7 miles of trail and lightly-travelled gravel roads before the current route shifts onto a paved road section.

Construction of these trail sections means that the MST is now almost completely off road for 361 miles - through the entire mountain region from Great Smoky Mountains National Park and into the western edge of the Piedmont.

Carter Falls Purchased for the Trail

Do you remember voting on the Connect NC bond referendum in Spring 2016? Thanks if you voted yes, because that bond made it possible for State Parks to purchase 43 acres that include a spectacular but largely unknown waterfall in Wilkes County for the future route of the trail in Segment 6. Thanks also to Dan Park who sold the precious property and donated an easement on an additional 11 acres and to the leaders of EVTA who worked with him, State Parks, and Wilkes County to pull the whole deal together.

The Falls are located between Elkin and Stone Mountain State Park. With permission from State Parks, EVTA volunteers have already built a small parking lot and a loop trail so people can visit the Falls now. They are raising money for a "bridge of dreams" over the creek that will become the route of the MST. Thanks to their hard, creative work, we are getting close to a continuous off-road trail from Clingmans Dome to downtown Elkin.

An MST "Foothold" in Guilford County

Since the MST was first envisioned, no trail had been built between Hanging Rock State Park and Greensboro's watershed lakes - a gap of 43 miles in MST Segment 8. Long distance MST hikers slogged the roads through

this area, and local residents have had few nearby trails to enjoy. Now thanks to the energy of MST Trail Town Oak Ridge and the foresight of Guilford County, a 1.5-mile section of the MST opened through the county's Cascades Preserve in May 2019.

This trail is gorgeous in its own right, as it meanders past cascading streams, towering hardwood trees and native shrubs and wildflowers. But it also established that first foothold in an area that always seems to inspire local residents to build another section and yet another. And that is just what is happening in Oak Ridge, where local volunteers got right to work after the Cascades trail opened to start constructing another 1.5 miles along the headwaters of the Haw River that they hope to open in late 2020 or early 2021.

A Walk Through History in Johnston County

Friends of MST volunteers stepped in to help NC Historic Sites and Friends of Bentonville Battlefield build a new 2.3-mile trail through fields and forests where the last major battle of the Civil War took place in March 1865 (Segment 12). Interpretive signs help hikers along the beautiful and solemn trail learn more about how the battle unfolded on the land. This is the first section of MST to cross the 2000+ acre state historic site, and Friends of MST is working with staff there on trail maintenance and plans for additional trail.

Generous Donations Spur Trail Design and Volunteer Work in the Coastal Plain

With a grant of \$100,000 in November 2018, the Duke Energy Foundation helped Friends of MST focus full-time on developing plans for seven new trail sections in the Coastal Plain (Segments 12 to 15) that will total more than 67 miles when complete. Ben Jones, MST Coastal Crescent Project Manager, used his skills as a landscape architect to develop detailed trail designs, engage community leaders and land managing agencies, and organize workdays for volunteers to build new trail and improve MST signage.

Friends launched a fundraising campaign to match Duke's grant and keep our work in this part of the state moving ahead full steam. By the end of 2019, Dominion Energy Foundation, REI, White Lake Marine, First Citizens Bank and Patagonia had already made generous gifts totaling \$85,000 to support this vital work.

Friends Gather in Surf City

More than 270 Friends came together in Surf City in March 2019 for the first ever "Gathering of Friends" in the eastern part of the state. Friends had invited trail communities from all over North Carolina to submit proposals for the 2019 Gathering, and Surf City and Pender County won us over with their creative ideas, accommodations and overall hospitality. Plus we were eager to help members learn more about this special part of the MST.

Hurricane Florence then hit Surf City and all of eastern North Carolina with a vengeance in September 2018. But with grace and resilience, the community started to rebuild and soon told us that they wanted to welcome us anyway – just six months after the storm. They saw the MST Gathering as a hopeful event to work toward and celebrate when it arrived.

The timing of the Gathering gave Friends a special opportunity to be purposeful partners in their rebuilding. As part of the event, MST members volunteered to rebuild houses with Habitat for Humanity and restore trails and the visitor center at Moores Creek National Battlefield.

When the Gathering weekend arrived, the weather was perfect – sunny and warm – so Friends could enjoy all the scheduled "excursions," including trail hikes, beach walks, paddling on the sound, exploring trail communities and just spending time together. Central events of the weekend included a reception and tour at the Karen Beasley Sea Turtle Rescue and Rehabilitation Center, dinner at the Surf City Community Center and the Annual Membership Meeting followed by a group hike over the new Surf City Bridge – now a part of the MST – at sunset.

A 42nd Birthday Party for the MST

Celebrating the MST's anniversary has become a tradition, and more than 700 people joined in the 42nd birthday celebrations during the weekend of September 6 to 9. The focus of 2019 was on



trail towns, and 27 of them organized guided hikes for the occasion. Plus seven hikers undertook a challenge of hiking 42 miles in two days and jointly raising more than \$2,500 for the trail.

Thanks to Great Outdoor Provision Co. for its birthday gift of \$15,000 to support the event and for donating fun gear to outfit all the hike leaders with shirts, socks, water bottles, patches, and packs.

Other Trail Improvements

MST volunteer leaders throughout the mountains submitted proposals to the Blue Ridge Parkway and State Parks for trail reroutes for short sections still on the road in Segments 1, 2 and 5 and new campsites in Segments

2 and 3. The BRP will undertake an environmental assessment to evaluate the feasibility of the projects.

The NC High Peaks Trail Association, one of our volunteer task forces in MST Segment 4, has led a multi-year project to rehabilitate the MST from Black Mountain Campground to the Mt. Mitchell summit, a distance of about six miles with 3,684 feet of elevation gain. This iconic and very popular trail was built unsustainably years ago, and it had badly eroded. High Peaks contracted with the American Conservation Experience (ACE) to rebuild the trail one section at a time. The contracts with ACE were funded with grants from the federal Recreational Trails Program, administered by NC State Parks.

Thanks to a \$5,000 grant from REI stores in Charlotte, we were able to restore 4.4 miles of the MST in the Pisgah National Forest (Segment 4) that follow old, eroded road beds near Old House Gap, west of Woodlawn and near Betsy's Ridge. The funds were used to hire a professional trail builder to re-contour the trail and create water diversions with a small backhoe. Twenty-two volunteers from the Central Blue Ridge Task Force then did the finish work of smoothing out 35 water diversions by hand. REI's Charlotte Market Coordinator Joy Shuck joined the task force on a beautiful winter's day.

This is just one example of the generous support REI gives to the trail. In 2019, REI stores in Raleigh and Durham also supported the trail with a \$20,000 grant for trail guides, signs and tools, plus all the REI stores in North Carolina made a special \$20,000 grant to help build and restore trails in the Coastal Plain impacted by Hurricanes Florence and Michael.

In Segment 6, the Elkin Valley Trail Association built 3/4 of a mile of trail along Rt. 268 east of Elkin. When opened, this section will eliminate part of the worst road walk in this segment.

In Segment 8, between Summerfield and Greensboro, a long-anticipated pedestrian tunnel under Battleground Avenue (US 220) opened. The tunnel allows the MST to remain on the Atlantic & Yadkin Greenway for an additional 0.5 mile and eliminates a dangerous highway crossing and road walk.

The Upper Haw Task Force undertook several large reconstruction projects to repair bridges, boardwalks, and steps along the Greensboro watershed lakes (Segment 8) and along the Haw River in Glencoe (Segment 9). Projects like this have been happening more frequently because of hurricanes, heavy rainfall, and upstream development expanding flood zones.

In Saxapahaw (Segment 9), the Upper Haw River Task Force worked with Alamance County to build new trail off Petty Road, on the west side of the Haw River. This trail will eventually become part of the MST route as Alamance County secures more land and easements to extend the trail north.

In Segment 9, the Town of Hillsborough extended the MST west 1/3 mile from Gold Park to Eno Mountain Road and then NCDOT constructed a sidewalk 500 ft along Eno Mountain Rd to a tract of land just acquired by State Parks. Friends of MST volunteers will work to complete a trail across that land to connect into the Occoneechee Mountain State Natural Area.

The Eno River Task Force (Segment 10), in a Herculean show of strength, rebuilt a bridge over Nancy Rhodes Creek that had been destroyed in Hurricane Florence. Floodwaters were strong enough to bend the 35-foot steel I-beams that form the base of the bridge. Not wanting to waste good building materials, the task force found a way to straighten them after determining that it could be done with little impact on the final strength of the beams. The bridge is now back in place but two feet higher and with handrails for added safety. This reconstruction as well as two earlier bridge projects in Segment 10 were funded with a Durham County Open Space matching grant.

The Falls Lake Task Force (Segment 10) has also been stabilizing bridges with foundations that are being undercut by heavier storm surges in recent years. They completed two major projects and multiple smaller ones in 2019.

In Segment 13, Coastal Crescent Project Manager Ben Jones organized a series of workdays to build a new section of trail at Turnbull Creek Educational State Forest and also to install sign bollards and improve blazing in the Bladen Lakes State Forest and Jones and Singletary Lake state parks.

Because of a major project to restore longleaf pine habitat at Stones Creek Game Land near Sneads Ferry (Segment 15), several miles of trail built by MST volunteers had to be abandoned. A more direct trail route through the property was retained so that hikers can observe the transformation and increased biodiversity of the property, and thru-hikers can continue to use this trail as respite on statewide treks.

Our partner Carteret County Wildlife Club that built and maintains the Neusiok Trail portion of the MST in the Croatan National Forest (Segment 16) worked closely with the US Forest Service to begin reopening the trail that was badly damaged by Hurricane Florence in September 2018. By the end of 2019, the trail had reopened from NC 306 to Oyster Point, but Pine Cliff Recreation Area and the section of trail north of NC 306 was so badly damaged that the Forest Service had begun planning for how to rebuild it in a more sustainable way farther away from the shore where it will be less vulnerable to hurricanes and major storms.

On the Outer Banks (Segment 18), the Marc Basnight bridge over the Oregon Inlet opened on February 25, shifting the MST route off the old Bonner Bridge. The new bridge is about 0.7 mile longer than the old, but the bike/ pedestrian lane is considerably wider.

Other News

UNC Press invited Friends to write a guide book to 40 great day hikes on the MST. Trail Resource Manager Jim Grode wrote and compiled the book with suggestions from many trail leaders. The book is scheduled for release in March 2020.

For Valentine's Day 2019, Raleigh pottery artist Courtney Pernell made a gift of trail magic for hikers along the Falls Lake section. Volunteers hung 100 of her small pottery stars and three small pottery hearts along the trail for hikers to discover and take home. People who found the stars and hearts were encouraged to post a photo to Facebook or Instagram, and anyone who found a heart could claim a special prize of one of Court's mugs or an MST trail guide.

Eager to see awareness of the MST grow, the Friends of MST Board of Directors decided to hire a marketing consultant to help develop a plan to inspire people to hike the trail and get involved in building, protecting and promoting it; to elevate awareness of the central role of Friends of MST; and to expand our reach to communities of color, to women, and to younger trail enthusiasts. EBS Strategies began working on the plan with staff, board, and volunteers in September 2019 with a projected completion date of February 2020. A particularly helpful pro bono contribution was made by member and professional pollster Martin DeWitt of Piedmont Insight who conducted an online survey of members, volunteers and people who are on the email list. Look in this annual report for some of the comments we received from donors and volunteers who completed the survey.

Eleven Hikers Complete the MST

While most people use the trail for day hikes or weekend backpacking trips, eleven intrepid people who took on the challenge of following the trail across North Carolina completed the entire journey in 2019. The 2019 class of

Friends of MST Grows and Changes

Friends added two staff members, welcomed a summer intern, and said farewell with many thanks to its long-time volunteer bookkeeper. Ben Jones, who had volunteered and interned while working on his master's of landscape architecture degree from NC State University, began work full-time as Coastal Crescent Project Manager.

Liz Dean, a retired CPA, who had kept the books as an able and delightful volunteer since 2008, stepped down from that role in March 2019. We then welcomed Carrie Vernia as part-time Office Assistant from March to September. Carrie, a former ESL high school teacher and plant pathology researcher, first came to Friends as a volunteer, helping with membership records, thank you notes and renewal mailings.

The Raleigh office was busy in the summer of 2019 when we hosted Sarah Richardson, a University of Maryland student, as an intern. Sarah, a student at the University of Maryland, helped organize the 42nd Birthday Hike and wrote a number of wonderful blogs about trail angels, trail volunteers and trail communities as well.

Five new members joined the Board of Directors in 2019: Dr. Bill Blackley of Elkin, Lynne Bresler of Chapel Hill, Heather Cotton of Marion/Black Mountain, Carl DeAndrade of White Lake, and Mark Rostan of Valdese. We give great thanks for the service of four members who stepped off the Board after completing their terms: Tiffiny Consoli of Raleigh, J.K. Coward of Sylva, Howard Lee of Chapel Hill, and B Townes of Boomer.


